History or Hoax *Topic 6 – Cold Case Files*

Some of the most interesting things that have ever happened, are also the most morbid. The Holocaust for example, is a brutal display of anti-semi-

tism, and is representative of how little some people care for other human life. A horrible event, arguably the most brutal in all of history; however, there is lots to be learned from it, and the mere idea that modern humans would even do such a thing is mind boggling, and therefore, the holocaust is a constantly interesting subject. This is just an example. Serial killers are often popular amongst researchers. Once

again, the lack of humanity and the idea of somebody having such a lack of empathy that they can murder someone time and time again, is just fascinating. I think all of these things are interesting, at least. And I know of many people who think so as well, so here I will elaborate upon some of (in my opinion) the most interesting, yet lesser known, morbid subjects.

Madeleine McCann. The name does not likely ring a bell, unless you are an avid researcher of child abductions. This case, is unfortunately unsolved, but that doesn't mean there isn't fuel for interest within its details. Madeleine McCann was three years old, and staying in a resort on a family vacation. She and her younger siblings were left alone while her mother, father, and a group of friends ate at a restaurant within the resort. The parents say that the children were checked on every half hour by a member of the party. At 10:14PM she was reported missing. There are multiple disputes about witnesses. A couple staying at the resort states that they saw a strange man carrying

a child matching Madeleine's description at around 10:00PM. There was an initial suspect, an artist, who had been staying at the resort at the same time as the McCanns. A drawing was found in his book of a man carrying a little girl who was seemingly unconscious. He was later ruled

out as a suspect.

Another particularly interesting case is that of three Australian children, who all went missing at the same time. The Beaumont children, Jane (nine), Arnna (seven), and Grant (four), lived in a popular seaside suburb of Australia, and would often visit the beach. The left for the beach at around 10:00AM, and were to return home at 2:00PM for lunch, per their

mother's instructions. They rode the bus to the beach and were supposed to ride it home. A woman reported seeing them playing under a sprinkler around 10:15AM, and saw a lean, blond man in a blue swimsuit watching them. He then approached, and began playing with them. The next witness reports them buying snacks at a cake shop, which was odd, because they had not left the house with enough money to do so. A logical assumption can be made that the children were given money. The last evewitness was a postman who was very familiar and friendly with the children. He reported seeing them walking away from the beach around 3:00PM, happy, and even stopping to say hello. There was nothing he could tell wrong with them. Police trusted his claim, but evidence leads them to believe that he saw them earlier in the day than he really said. The Beaumont children have not been found to this day, and their kidnapper. or whatever may have happened to them


2. Moisturize. The winter wants to suck out the happiness from your skin and sometimes being as soft as a baby dolphin, just simply makes things a little more bright.


Directions



Xenophobia is defined as "intense or irrational dislike or fear of people from other countries" or "the fear of that which is perceived to be foreign or strange."

A similar form of xenophobia can be found today in the United Kingdom. Recently Syrians have fled their country to seek refuge in countries where they believed they could keep themselves and their families safe, because they felt their home country was dangerous. In the United Kingdom there has been controversy, as the refugees in Cardiff have been forced to wear red wristbands as a form of identification as a refugee. These wristbands

Not only is there current day xenophobia in the United Kingdom, but there is also rising xenophobia in the United States. The potential GOP presidential candidate Donald Trump (Drumpf), known for getting his foot stuck in his mouth, is also very well known for his dislike of immigrants, namely Muslims and Mexicans. In an interview with Yahoo News in November 2015. Trump said he would consider requiring Muslim-Americans to register with a government database or mandating they carry special ID cards that note their faith (CNN. com). While this isn't exactly a "yellow star," it's still requiring a certain group of people be treated differently and identified by a people group they're a part of, even if they're legal citizens of the United States.

This is a great example of why history classes are important. Staying informed on what's going on in the world and comparing it to things that have happened in history are some of the only ways to avoid a second Holcaust or another World War.

These feelings were pushed onto and encouraged in the public by Hitler and others in leadership positions at that time. Because of the hatred of the Jewish people, they were forced to identify themselves by wearing yellow cloth Star of David pinned to their clothing at all times. The Jewish people were made to wear these stars as a form of humiliation and segregation and so they would be easier to

have led to the persecution, harassment, and abuse by members of the public. You may think a simple solution would be to stop wearing the wristband, but if the refugees don't, they aren't given food at the housing where they stay. Not only are they forced to wear the wristbands, but front doors of their housing were painted the same red as their wristbands, which has led to vandalism and targeting of refugee housing, similar to the way Jewish businesses were targeted in Germany.




Bevin Makes Cuts

It's no news to anyone that Americans love to spend money. Enough money to add up to 18 trillion dollars that this country owes. This debt is a big burden on America and many politicians are scrambling to find out just how to solve this problem. In efforts to stop this problem, newly elected governor Matt Bevin, recently proposed a new





budget that would cut a lot of money that a lot of Kentuckians relied on. Some government jobs are at risk, some are worried that the Kentucky arts program will be cut and that teacher pensions will be lowered. According to the courier journal "Details of the impact of these cuts are not yet known. Bevin said it will be the job of his cabinet secretaries to determine how best to apply their reduced appropriations. He told reporters before the speech that his budget does not eliminate funding

for the Kentucky Arts Council – a fear of the state's arts community. But his plan does cut the council's parent agency – The Tourism, Arts and Heritage Cabinet and it will be that cabinet secretary's job to determine how to cope with the cut." As regards to the teacher pensions he says that he will add to the teacher pension system. Bevin said that he would add 1.1 billion in funding for the Kentucky teacher retirement system. With all of this said. none of this is set in stone. First it will go

to the Kentucky house, if passed it will go to the senate where the republicans have control.



And thus another Oscar race comes to an end. There weren't too many surprises when it comes to the trophy winners themselves. The big topic this year was the lack of diversity amongst the acting nominees, or #OscarsSoWhite. A massive negative reaction to the second consecutive year with no African American acting nominees prompted the Academy to announce "substantive changes" with the goal of "doubling the number of women and diverse members of the Academy by 2020." Chris Rock returned as host almost ten years after his first appearance and people seem to be mostly satisfied with him this year. He handled the controversy pretty much exactly as you would expect Chris Rock to do, his opening monologue being the highlight. The jokes in between... not so much, mostly falling flat and teetering on offensive and low-brow.

Speaking of the acting categories, did you Leonard DiCaprio won Best Actor for The Revenant? Of course you did. His win generated a whopping 440,000 Tweets per minute, making it the most-tweeted moment of an Oscars telecast ever. Brie Larson, who you may recognize from 2012's 21 Jump Street took home Best Actress for her emotionally harrowing performance in Room. Swedish actress Alicia Vikander had a very good year in 2015, appearing in as Ava in the existential sci-fi Ex Machina, Guy Ritchie's The Man From U.N.C.L.E., and The Danish Girl of which she won Best Supporting Actress. I have a feeling this isn't the last we'll be seeing of these two actresses at the Oscars. If you followed the Oscar race this year, you knew all of the acting categories were pretty much locks,

which makes it all the more upsetting when Mark Rylance took home Best Supporting Actor for Bridge of Spies over Sylvester Stallone in his iconic role as an aged Rocky Balboa in Creed. This was easily the biggest upset of the night.

Mad Max: Fury Road unsurprisingly swept the technical categories, winning six in total including Best Editing, Costume Design, Makeup & Hairstyling, Sound Editing and Mixing, and Production Design. The glaring one missing being, in a big surprise, Visual Effects which was taken by Ex Machina, mentioned earlier. The Academy here was likely impressed by the CGI work with its low budget, as the film is pretty independent as opposed to the flashy big budget, practical effects of Star Wars: The Force Awakens and Mad Max, Emmanuel Lubezki won his third consecutive Oscar for his cinematography for The Revenant, a feat never before seen until this year. The creator or Anchorman, Adam McKay, now has an Oscar for his screenplay for the star-studded The Big Short. Tom McCarthy, the writer and director of one of the worst movies of 2015 (The Cobbler starring Adam Sandler) won Best Original Screenplay for Spotlight, the true story of how reporters of the Boston Globe uncovered the massive scandal of child molestation within the Catholic Church. In a bit of an underwhelming conclusion, the film collected the Best Picture prize.



FILM FLASHBACK: 'SCREAM' TURNS 20

Messenger Reporters Twenty years ago this December, the first of Wes Craven's "Scream" series sliced its way into theaters. The film would go on to generate three sequels and a TV series, which debuted on MTV last year. The second, third and fourth installments generally received mixed-to-positive reviews, but no follow-up could match the surprise and originality of the first film.

Following an aggressive bidding war for Kevin Williamson's script, originally titled "Scary Movie," it was settled that famed producers Bob and Harvey Weinstein would foot the bill for the film and horrorfilm legend Wes Craven (director, "A Nightmare on Elm Street") would

direct. Craven's meta 1994 sequel "A New Nightmare" could be seen as a predecessor to the self-awareness of "Scream": the film saw original "Nightmare on Elm Street" actress Heather Langenkamp playing herself and facing off with a revamped Freddy Krueger in real life. The "Scream" screenplay, also somewhat meta and self-referential. successfully turned the slasher genre on its head by making the slashers' victims teenagers who were well-versed in the tropes of slasher films.

"Scream" follows Sidney (Neve Campbell), a teenage girl whose mother's brutal homicide remains unsolved. Several years later, her town is being shaken by murder again-despite being billed on the poster, Drew Barrymore is killed

off in the very first scene. Her killer wears a generic Halloween ghostface costume, and he forces her to answer horror movie trivia questions before slaving her. The film's supporting cast includes David Arquette, Courteney Cox, and a delightfully insane Matthew Lillard.

"Scream" broke down the door for a new kind of genre mash: the meta horror-comedy. The trend's infant stages began in the 1980s with films like "An American Werewolf in London" (1981) and "Evil Dead II" (1987), and continued well into this century. The \$103 million "Scream" raked in at domestic box office almost certainly had something

to do with the success of films like "Shaun of the Dead" (2004), "Zombieland" (2009), and "The Cabin in the Woods" (2011), which may be the single most meta horror-comedy since "Scream."

His depiction of District Attorney Davidson is a understated touchstone in his Hollywood reawakening, "The McConaissance." One can only hope the two actors may appear in more of Linklater's projects in the future.

The Life of Pablo; Album Review

To put it simply, the excitement around and immediately following Kanye West's seventh studio album The Life of Pablo was extraordinary. Twitter rants, three album title changes, controversial lyrics, the \$53 million in debt Kanye announced he was in, and Kanye's claim that it would be the greatest album of all time-all coupled with Kanye's pre-existing reputation as one of the most divisive celebrity personas today-were all sources of this tremendous anticipation. Many critics and fans alike were ready to dismiss Kanye and TLOP. It appeared he didn't have a clear vision for this one, and considering his essentially flawless six-album run. it looked as though he was due for a flop.

Kanye debuted The Life of Pablo to a sold-out Madison Square Garden on February 11. Well, sort of. That version of The Life of Pablo had ten songs. 48 hours later, the public got another, 18-track version of The Life of Pablo. Kanye evidently spent the hours leading up to The Life of Pablo's early February morning digital release still finishing the album, still tweaking the tracklist. At one point, on "30 Hours," Kanye references the Madison Square Garden release party for the album on the album that he'd already released. And as far as we know, we may still not have a final version of The Life of Pablo. West tweeted shortly after the album's release that he would be "fixing" the Frank Ocean-assisted "Wolves." The album's exclusivity to the Jav Z-co-owned streaming service Tidal means the album is forever in digital limbo. It's a living, breathing, unfinished album, one



that West can continue tweaking and updating and fixing into infinity if he so chooses.

Although structure could be seen as the album's biggest weakness, this isn't the fault of the tracks themselves; there are few if any truly weak tracks on Pablo. "Ultralight Beam" kicks off TLOP with heavy soul sampling in accordance with West's announcement that this would be gospel album. This is fitting as on "Ultralight Beam" Kanye mainly discusses his faith, draws parallels between himself and the Apostle Paul, and establishes many of the main themes of the album.

Kanye is more sober, more personal and more introspective on The Life of Pablo than he's been since

2008's 808s & Heartbreak. On "Real Friends," he admits his own failures as a family member and friend: "When was the last time I remembered a birthdav?/ When was the last time I wasn't in a hurry?" Here West hints at his own depression and makes references throughout the album to his own mental state, something the media has been speculating about for weeks. "You ain't never seen nothing crazier than/ This n--ga when he off his Lexapro," he says on "FML." but "Feedback" sees him demanding, "Name one genius that ain't crazy." Kanye raps uninterrupted for four straight minutes on "No More Parties in L.A.," and one line from that song, "My psychiatrist got kids that I inspired," has already been cited as one of the best rap lvr-

ics of the year.


It's not entirely clear why West jumbled his tracklist before the release: one Twitter user has observed that if you sequence the album in order of the original, three-act-structured tracklist that Kanve gave us, the album is much more cohesive. You get the feeling cohesion wasn't a priority for Kanye this time around. As far as structuring and transitioning goes, The Life of Pablo is a mess. That being said, it's probably the best-produced, most brilliant and compelling mess you'll hear all year. Clumsy on its feet as it may be, there are

way too many great songs on the album for it to ever be called anything less than great or very good. In both structure and overall sound, The Life of Pablo is very much a greatest hits album–all the sounds Kanve has pioneered over the last twelve years over six albums can be found here. West moves haphazardly from 808s & Heartbreak AutoTune to the soul samples of The College Dropout to the experimental minimalism of Yeezus, and he dares you to keep up with him. The album is so engaging and so listenable because the moment you start growing tired of a certain Kanye sound, another completely different Kanye sound begins. These are sounds Kanve has mastered before, but what is decidedly his least experimental album also manages to be his weirdest album yet.
